

Housing Assistance for Medina County Households Resulting from the Coronavirus Pandemic

The Medina Metropolitan Housing Authority has received additional funding from the Ohio Housing Finance Agency to aid Medina County households facing housing challenges resulting from the Coronavirus Pandemic.

This funding will be used to prevent evictions and/or housing loss due to COVID-19 related decline in income, wage reduction, job loss, health challenges and similar situations.

Funds for those who qualify may be used for short-term rental assistance, security deposits, moving costs, landlord verifications, etc. Up to six months of rental assistance may be provided, including arrears. Priority will be given to households at greater risk of contracting COVID-19 including seniors age 60 and better as well as those with underlying health conditions.

Eligibility includes income limits of no more than 50% of the Medina County median income, adjusted for family size; they include:

Rental amount restrictions also apply.
